SELPA: Special Education Local Plan Area

- The California Legislature implements the provisions of I.D.E.A. through the "California Master Plan for Special Education".
- In 1977, all school districts and county school offices in California were required to form geographical regions of sufficient size and scope to provide for all special education service needs of children residing within the region's boundaries

SELPAs provide targeted technical assistance resulting in quality special education programming and increased student engagement in the least restrictive environment. As partners in special education compliance monitoring and Differentiated Assistance processes, SELPAs utilize continuous improvement as a framework for identifying equity gaps to improve student professional development on high leverage, evidenced-based practices, and SELPAs are key collaborators on numerous statewide reform efforts.











SWDs Served = 2,739




Santa Clara SELPA II: Students Served
