





COMMUNITY TRUSTEE AREA DISTRICTING COMMITTEE (CTAD)

The CTAD is made up of 16 members representing various community stakeholders within FUHSD.

Our responsibilities have included:

- educating the community;
- expanding community engagement;
- feedback analysis and synthesis; and
- presenting recommendations on maps and sequencing to the school board.

The Board is responsible for making the final decision on the map.

5 OF 6 CTAD MEETINGS

Over 18 hours of training, planning and reporting.

36 COMMUNITY OUTREACH EVENTS

Includes in-person workshops, webinars, small group meetings, and in-person/webinar community meetings.

1ST RECOMMENDATION

TO THE BOARD

CTAD'S RECOMMENDATION INCLUDES:

MAP CRITERIA

To the extent possible, the following criteria must be used to draw maps, in this order of priority:

FEDERAL LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

- Population Balance
- Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965

STATE LEGAL REQUIREMENTS (AB764)

- Contiguous
- Maintain Communities of Interest
- City/census designated places
- Natural/artificial boundaries
- Compactness

Maps may not be drawn to favor or discriminate against political parties, incumbents or candidates.

COMMUNITIES OF INTEREST

- School Attendance Boundaries
- Neighborhood Communities
- Cities
- Travel Distance to School/Transportation
- Elementary and Middle School Boundaries

SEQUENCING

- Sequencing is unique to each map.
- Sequencing refers to determining which areas have elections each election cycle (2024 or 2026)
- Two areas will be up for election in Cycle 1 (2024) and three areas will be up for election in Cycle 2 (2026)

SYNTHESIS OF FEEDBACK & SELECTION OF FOCUS MAPS

- Prior to March 11, CTAD was provided all of the feedback received by the district (community submitted maps, emails, raw survey data, etc.) for review.
- During the March 11 CTAD meeting, the committee discussed the feedback themes (communities of interest) and the **25** community submitted maps.
- All **25** maps were reviewed, **9** were compliant, **3** were noncompliant and **13** were not recommended by legal counsel for one of the following reasons:
 - Consolidated Asian CVAP into fewer areas
 - Split Hispanic CVAP between multiple areas
 - Variance close to the total population criteria limit (<10%)
- All maps were clustered together in like-groups to better see what themes were emerging and how they reflected the community feedback
- Over the course of several hours, the maps were narrowed down to the top three options that best represented the feedback received to date.













- Keeps neighborhood communities together, such as Blue Hills, Rancho Rinconada and SNAIL
- Follows Stelling Rd, De Anza Blvd, Bollinger Rd and Fremont Ave
