

# THE SCHOOL BOARD DECIDED TO MOVE TO TRUSTEE AREAS IN ORDER TO...



#### Comply with the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA)

Across the state CVRA lawsuits can only be brought against At-Large elections, not By-Trustee Area elections. No local agency has successfully won a CVRA challenge, and they are very expensive to fight.



#### Provide more direct representation of the district as a whole

Community members have communicated to the Board about the lack of representation in certain areas of the district. With trustee area elections, more diverse candidates may run for the Board and board members may have a stronger on-the ground understanding of the impact of local issues.



### Make it more accessible & less expensive to run for the Board

The financial costs and time for individuals to campaign are much less.

FUHSD is proactively transitioning to retain control over the process and avoid costly fees that will take funds away from our students.

### MAP CRITERIA

To the extent possible, the following criteria must be used to draw maps, in this order of priority:

#### FEDERAL LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

**Population Balance:** each area shall contain nearly equal populations with less than 10% total variance, based on the latest Census data (2020). FUHSD has a total population of 240,655, this means about 48,000 per trustee area.

**Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965:** lines may not be drawn to deny minority voters the right to participate in the political process and should not dilute the minority vote.

#### STATE LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

#### California AB764:

- Contiguous when all parts of the trustee area are touching without any gaps
- Maintain Communities of Interest keeping identified communities together
- City/census designated places follow city boundaries, no designated places within District
- Natural/artificial boundaries rivers, freeways, main roads, etc.
- Compactness

#### **SEQUENCING**


- Sequencing will be unique to each map.
- Sequencing refers to determining which areas have elections each election cycle (2024 or 2026)
- Two areas will be up for election in Cycle 1 (2024) and three areas will be up for election in Cycle 2 (2026)

Maps may not be drawn to favor or discriminate against political parties, incumbents or candidates.







- presenting recommendations on maps and sequencing to the school board. The Board is responsible for making the final decision on the map.

Includes in-person workshops, webinars, small group meetings, and in-person/webinar community meetings.


Other items include: creating maps based on community feedback, revision of outreach materials, in-depth exploration of community concerns and solutioning, and networking.


