


PROCESS FOR APPOINTING A COMMITTEE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR

- Decision: Each committee member will read their decision aloud. The scores will be totaled and the member with the most Cs will be nominated as Chair and a committee member will need to make a motion and another member will need to make a second for this person to be appointed as Chair. Repeat for Vice Chair.








COMMITTEE SYTHENSIZES INPUT

The CTAD Committee, in partnership with the District's consultants, reviews community input and maps, to synthesize into a few focus maps.

The Superintendent presents the CTAD Committee focus maps to the Board of Trustees.

PUBLIC HEARING: MAP SELECTION

COMMUNITY OUTREACH & EDUCATION ABOUT THE TRANSITION TO BY-TRUSTEE AREA ELECTIONS PHASE 1 AND 2

Postcard



All 105,000 residences in the District received a postcard notifying them of the transition to By–Trustee Area elections and the dedicated webpage where regular updates on the process are posted.

Pop-Up Events



Approx. 750 individuals stopped by FUHSD booths at Back to School Nights, the Cupertino Fall Festival and other local events. FUHSD has tabled 11 pop-up events to date.

Informational Presentations



FUHSD District staff have presented at PTSA, staff and other community meetings. FUHSD has made approximately 15 informational presentations across the district.

Network



FUHSD leveraged its network of PTAs, cities, feeder elementary school districts, and community groups.

Websites



The FUHSD Trustee Area website went live at the start of August, with 5,646 page views to date. The CTAD Committee website went live mid-October, with 984 page views to date.

Social Media



FUSHD has shared multiple posts about the Trustee Area process to it's 3,800 followers.

Email Blasts



FUSHD has sent multiple emails about the Trustee Area process, CTAD and workshops to approx. 30,000 individuals (parents and families).

Media



The San Jose Mercury News ran a story on FUHSD transitioning from At-Large to By-Trustee Areas, with approx. 313,000 daily readership.







Email Verification

After you create your account it no longer states that you need to verify your account by going to your email. Now it states "thank you". You are able to log in right away.

Submission of Map - Comment Prompt - Communication about goals or intent of maps:

The current prompt is "Provide a narrative description of the proposed plan, preferably in 250 words or less. The narrative may include a description of how the plan complies with the instructions for submitting a redistricting plan."

Trustee Area Tables:

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The software does not calculate overall variance. So community members will have to calculate that themselves (Absolute Value of the Highest Trustee Area Variance + Absolute Value of the Lowest Trustee Area Variance)

Maptitude is going to see if the word "deviation" can be changed to "variance" in the table and change the CVAP percentages to show Hispanic and Asian CVAP as a percentage of total CVAP. Currently, they are displayed as a percentage of the total population.

How is variance is calculated?:

Variance of a Trustee Area: (TA Population-Average of all 5 Trustee Areas)/ Average of all 5 Trustee Areas

Total Overall Variance: Absolute Value of the Highest Trustee Area Variance + Absolute Value of the Lowest Trustee Area Variance
