






On a scale of 1 - 5, do you agree with the recommendation to extend the LSSAP and MSSAP programs for two more years?

World Language Background/ Statement of the Problem

Details About World Language Programming

- 1. FUHSD currently offers 20 levels of language across all 5 sites
 - a. Level 1 through 5 (Advanced Placement)
 - b. Chinese, French, Japanese and Spanish
- 1. We have struggled to maintain 20 levels of language even when most of our sites were enrolled with over 2,000 students
 - a. Enrollment too low to offer level 1 or 2 in a language (e.g. LHS Chinese 1 and 2)
 - b. Enrollment too low to offer level 4 or 5 and end up with a combination course (e.g. FHS French 4= 9 students, FHS French AP= 6 students . . . MVHS Japanese 4=7, MVHS Japanese AP=16)
- 1. As we get smaller, not only will our classes, naturally, become smaller, the number of singletons will continue to increase and create additional challenges in our scheduling process which will further limit access to student course requests.






The Reduction Isn't Only Declining Enrollment

Guiding Principles Behind Change to World Language Offerings

- 1. Current numbers of students across all languages and sites has become increasingly complex in terms of student scheduling
- 2. The lowest enrolled language at each site proposed to be reduced
- 3. Phase out will occur over time so that all students enrolled in a language will be able to complete their high school course sequence
- 4. By reducing the number of languages offered, students will sign up for the remaining courses in order to create more robust and stable course enrollment
- 5. World Language, unlike other departments, requires coordination and planning in advance due to the sequential nature of courses
- 6. Maintain all 4 languages within FUHSD

Current Scenarios FUHSD is Considering

<u>Scenario A:</u> Reduce course offerings at each school to include 3 languages per site:

Cupertino: Chinese, French, Spanish

Fremont: Chinese, Japanese, Spanish

Homestead: French, Japanese, Spanish

Lynbrook: Chinese, French, Spanish

Monta Vista: Chinese, French, Spanish

Scenario B: 3 Schools reduce offerings by one language, 2 schools maintain current offerings:

Cupertino: Chinese, French, Spanish

Fremont: Chinese, Japanese, Spanish

Homestead: Chinese, French, Japanese, Spanish

Lynbrook: Chinese, French, Japanese, Spanish

Monta Vista: Chinese, French, Spanish

Why Would FUHSD Offer Different Languages Between Sites?

- 1. During our April 2023 proposal we maintained a commitment to our schools/community that we would monitor enrollment trends in the district and within our world language programs.
- 1. In review of our enrollment for SY 2023-24, both HHS and LHS have maintained healthy course staffing and section allocations for all 4 languages.
- 1. Although the enrollment in Japanese is the lowest of the 4 languages at LHS, there is only one feeder school with Japanese language and that school feeds into LHS which presumably will continue to maintain healthy enrollment through this program.
- 1. CHS, FHS, and MVHS all have course totals of fewer than 120 students with the following enrollment within the proposed phased languages:
 - a. CHS Japanese= 83 students
 - b. FHS French= 112 students
 - c. MVHS Japanese= 111 students
